

LUTHER HALL

The origin of Luther Hall has its roots in the earliest history of Trinity, for this congregation has always had a deep concern for Christian Education. One of the first acts of the congregation in 1872 was the establishment of a Sunday School, which was replaced by a Christian School the next year. The first school building was constructed in 1874 and when that building was found to be inadequate, a new one was built in 1897, just prior to celebrating the 25th Anniversary of the congregation in 1898. The importance of the Sunday School was again recognized so that in 1923 it was organized.

The year the congregation celebrated its 75th Anniversary (1947) the congregation began its third school building and dedicated it in 1949. This is the present school attached to the church building. On May 20, 1962 the congregation added the Thyen Property, known as the Annex. This building served as a Kindergarten & Sunday School Classroom until the summer of 1973. Luther Hall replaced that building, giving additional space. It is noteworthy that this project takes place on an Anniversary date of the congregation, the 100th.!

In 1969 the Parish Renewal Through Education program was proposed by Synod, and after study by Pastor Knief & Teacher Kenneth Kulow it was suggested to the congregation Voters. It was approved on July 20, 1969. Don Wessler was asked to serve as Project Director, who, together with Chairman Jack Burrus and the Stewardship Committee, appointed the Parish Renewal Committee composed of Mrs. Kris Roegge, Mrs. Althea Carls, Mr. Wayne Strubbe, Miss Jeanette Maschmeier, Mrs. Gertrude Phelps, Mr. Chester Lutkehus, Mrs. Shirlee Wessler, Mr. Chris Roegge, Mr. Merle Dufelmeier, Mrs. Charles Roegge, Mr. Ken Phelps, Mr. Melvin Schone, Mr. Myron Beard, Mrs. Marilyn Werries, Mr. Gerald Beard and Mrs. Esther Morrison.

The Committee reported on the total educational program of the congregation, including its strengths and weaknesses and needs. The committee noted a great need for more adequate facilities for Sunday School & Bible classes on Sunday mornings, as well as a great need for storage of materials and supplies. Space was needed for the school teachers' office which led to a proposal that the Church Secretary's office be included in the general needs of the Educational facilities.

At the same time the Trustees had been reviewing the general condition of the properties of the congregation. They recommended to the Voters on April 19, 1970 that the Voters consider a building to replace the annex which was in need of extensive but prohibitive repairs. The Voters accepted this recommendation and continued to hear reports from the Parish Renewal Thru Education committee. In its October meeting, the Voters resolved to have the Parish Renewal Committee report to the assembled congregation on October 25, 1970, which was done.

Already earlier in 1970 some of the needs for educational facilities came to the attention of Mr. A. C. Hart of Arenzville. At that time he offered to donate the building and property of Luther Hall to Trinity. However, since Trinity was still in the midst of its Educational needs study, the offer was not immediately accepted. Further study of needs, congregational and community conditions all led the congregation to see the wisdom in accepting the generous offer of Mr. Hart. So it was in its July, 1971, meeting that the Voters formally accepted the offer of Mr. & Mrs. A. C. Hart and acquired our present building, which was at one time a general store, then a roller skating rink, then a part of a cabinet building shop and now used for Christian Education purposes.

After accepting the building, work was immediately done on the roof under the direction of the Trustees, Jack Schone, Wayne Strubbe & David Carls. Other work was planned to improve the outward appearance of the building in view of the congregation's Centennial Celebration in 1972. Thus the canopy running the entire length of the front was removed and the building window areas enclosed with brick early in 1972.

A Building and Planning Committee was then appointed to plan how best to use the

interior of the building. The Committee included Merle Lovekamp, Willard Peck, Edward Dufelmeier, Kenneth Phelps & Chris Roegge. This committee worked carefully and prayerfully and finally presented the plans for the present building to the Voters on April 16, 1972. These then were shared with the entire congregation on April 23 and approved by the Voters in a special meeting on April 30. The contracts were awarded to Huey Lumber Company, Arenzville, Illinois for the interior carpentry work; Natemeyer Plumbing and Heating, Arenzville, the plumbing heating of the building and Leischner Electric for the electrical work.

A work day was designated on January 10, 11, 12, 1972 to remove the debris from the interior of the building. The Trustees reported that more than 20 men came to help clean up the building those days.

The children, youth & adults of the congregation were invited to suggest names for the building. Of all the names suggested, the Board of Education selected the name "Luther Hall" as most appropriate. It was suggested by Leesa Kulow. The building was officially named at the April 16, 1972 Voters Meeting.

Actual remodeling of the interior did not begin until January, 1973. Work progressed through the spring. When it became evident that soon the building would be ready for use, the Voters authorized the appointment of a Furnishings Committee to provide furnishings commensurate with the use of the building and its decor. Members who served on this committee included Ross Houston, Chairman; Mr. & Mrs. Gerald Roegge; Mrs. Margit Schoonover; Mrs. Patricia Roegge; Steve Carls; Joni Schone and Mr. & Mrs. Harold Witte with guidance from the Pastor, Teachers Junge and Wahls, Board of Trustees & Board of Education.

After meeting with persons who would be using the Sunday School and Bible Class rooms, the committee recommended that each of the rooms be furnished with the following basic items: 10 chairs, folding adjustable table, cork-board, chalk board combination, and a book organizer. Equipment and furnishings for the Kindergarten room and the Church Secretary's office were recommended to the Voters and furnished with appropriate appointments. Other needs included: Room identifying plaques, refrigerated water cooler, outdoor building identifying sign, coat rack, drapes for Kindergarten and Office rooms, glass enclosed bulletin board, two teaching pedestals for class rooms desiring them rather than tables and the appointments for the rest rooms. All these items were provided by individual and groups within the congregation.

Luther Hall is a concrete block building 49 ft. X 100 ft. Its west rooms consists of three large classrooms, each 30 ft X 16 ft. Each of the three are further sub-divided into three smaller rooms by folding doors, to provide nine classrooms for Sunday School and Bible Classes on Sunday mornings. The first of the large rooms is used for Trinity Lutheran's Pre-kindergarten program two afternoons a week. A hallway divides these rooms on the west side of the building from the Kindergarten room, rest rooms, clerical secretary's office, youth room and store room on the east side of the building. The Youth room is 24 ft X 70 ft with a 9 ft ceiling. The Kindergarten room and the clerical secretary's room were a part of the original structure. All teaching rooms are used on Sunday mornings for Bible Study and Sunday School, including the youth room, which has an adult bible class meeting in it.

OUR THANKS

It is with thanks to God that we take note of the enthusiasm of members of the congregation with regard to this major undertaking. Many members donated much time and skill to bring it to completion. Members who contracted work donated their labor. They are: Mr. James Beard, Mr. John Leischner, Mr. Wilbur Natemeyer and Mr. Robert Natemeyer, Mrs. Jack Burrus and Mrs. Wilbur Lippert donated their time and skill in making the drapes for the Kindergarten room and the clerical Secretary's office. The window in the clerical Secretary's office was donated by Mr. Harold Witte and Mr. Merle Lovekamp and the

The Air conditioning for the Kindergarten and Secretary's office and the Hi Fi for the Youth room were donated by Mr. & Mrs. David Carls. The shrubs & landscaping between Luther Hall and the church was donated by the Walter Roegge family and the Edward Carls family. Many hours of labor and equipment and trucks were donated to prepare the building. The furnishings in the nine west rooms were donated by the following: Merle Lovekamp and Kenneth Roegge, Marlin Winkelman, Delmos Winkelman, Harlan Roegge, Richard Lovekamp, The Strubbe Family, Don Wessler Insurance, Beard Implement Co. and Trinity Lutheran Ladies Aid. Other donations toward the furnishings were made by the Fellowship League and Mrs. Eileen Dannewitz.

As we say these words of acknowledgment, we are also mindful of a whole host of members and friends who have given of themselves unselfishly during the past 2½ years while this project was being completed. Their names should also be included. We thank them all in the name of our Lord Jesus. We must also acknowledge that it is our gracious God who has worked within the hearts of His people to give them the will to do this.
